








Uganda

Part 2 Safari

- Sunday 22nd Tuesday 24th Visit Kibale Forest National Park. Spend an afternoon trekking wild chimpanzees in their natural habitat. Stay in the peaceful town of Fort Portal at the foot of the Ruwenzori Mountains.
- Wednesday 25th- Friday 27th Witness the might of the river Nile at Murchison Falls; board a boat trip up the Nile to the base of the Falls, then climb the falls; take part in several game drives searching for the Big Five (we saw lions and elephants last year), and also giraffes, hippos, crocodiles and other exotic beasts; finally visit a rhino sanctuary.



Accommodation and Travel

We hire a four-wheel drive bus, driver and a guide, who has worked for the Ugandan Wildlife Authority (UWA).





We will be staying in hotels, of varying degrees of luxury! Each one is different and so are the room arrangements but you will share a room with at least one other.

What do I need to be prepared for?

- **★2500.** This covers everything except vaccinations, anti-malarial tablets, souvenirs and snacks.
- We have to charge slightly more than the actual cost to include a contingency fund.
- Mowever, you will be expected to do fundraising, partly to reduce the cost.



- If still interested, please sign the register and ensure that you have a letter with attached information sheet.
- 29th September 2017: Deadline for applying by returning reply slip.
- In the week beginning 2nd October we will write to say if you are successfully on the trip.
- 13th October 2017: Deadline for returning medical consent/passport information forms & payment of first instalment of £800 (nonrefundable, to cover cost of flights). (6 months)





Passports and Visas

- You will need a passport that does not expire before February 2019 in order to enter Uganda. This is because the Ugandan Immigration Office applies a condition that travellers to Uganda must have an extra 6 months validity on their passports at the point of entry in order to be admitted.
- We obtain visas at the point of entry to Uganda, Entebbe International Airport. This usually involves queueing up for 2 hours or so but is actually more efficient than the alternative procedure of taking all passports to the Ugandan High Commission in London.





What if too many apply?

- The limit is 16 students.
- If the trip is oversubscribed, you may be asked to write a short letter, stating in what way you can contribute to the Uganda link and how you think you will benefit from participating in the trip.
- We might have to select students by drawing names from a hat.





When do we need to be paid?

- o 13th October £800 (we need to ask for a substantial first payment to book the flights)

- Cheques payable to Sir Thomas Rich's School or use on-line payment.





Fundraising

- We would like and expect you to participate in fundraising activities for the trip and for PMM School.
- Like last time, we will split all money from joint fundraising activities 50:50 between the PMM kitchen project and reducing your own individual costs. {We keep a separate tally of each member's contribution to do this.}
- This time we are setting a personal target for you to raise a minimum of £500 towards your own costs. This money will be reimbursed to you after the trip.
- Your share of the joint fundraising will contribute towards this total (at 50%) but you will probably need to supplement it by doing some individual fundraising.





Fundraising Ideas

- Last year, we raised money jointly by:
 - Holding cake sales (about 5)
 - Organising a sponsored bike ride
 - Bag packing at Sainsbury's, Asda and Tescos
 - Soak the teacher
- We will repeat some of these events this year. We would expect you to <u>be available</u> to participate in the major fundraising events.
- Any fundraising suggestions of your own are to be welcomed.
