Year 13 Geography residential fieldwork to Snowdonia

Thursday 28th March to Sunday 31st March 2019

We have organised a residential field visit to Snowdonia, North Wales, to study the impact of Glaciation on the landscape. These fieldwork days have been developed over the last 18 years to provide an in depth course that is a significant benefit to our A level students. In fact, we consider this course essential for all our A2 students to attend.

Travel arrangements for the fieldwork will involve travel by school minibuses driven and supervised by staff, all of whom have received relevant training. The teachers leading the visit will be Mr Gowler, Mr Carter, Mrs Brown and a retired colleague, Mr Pack. Our contact details are:

The itinerary is subject to variation due to the possibility of inclement weather, but is likely to be as follows:

Thursday – depart STRS at 9am and travel to Snowdonia. We intend to stop for an early lunch break at a service area, probably near Oswestry. We will then proceed to Snowdonia to complete our first afternoon of fieldwork. **Good boots are important, plus warm clothes and waterproofs**. Upon completing fieldwork we will travel a short distance to the YHA at the Pen-Y-Pass where once checked -in and fed, we will make use of their classroom facilities in the evening to analyse the day's fieldwork.

Friday– Fieldwork at several locations with a particular focus on the Glacial landforms of the Nant Ffrancon valley and Cwm Idwal. The day will involve being outside for several hours and pupils should expect some extended walking over uneven terrain. Once again we will work until late evening. In the evening pupils should expect to work in the classroom until at least 9pm. Some free time will be provided once we have consolidated the days learning.

Saturday– Fieldwork to study the impact of glacial activity on the lowland landscape of North Wales and Anglesey. This will involve minibus travel to the town of Beaumaris in the morning to look at depostional features. In the afternoon we will visit Llanberis and Bews-Y-Coed . The evening will once again involve an extended study programme.

Sunday – Depart hostel and complete any fieldwork that has been negatively impacted by inclement weather over the previous three days. We anticipate arriving back at STRS during the afternoon but cannot be precise at this stage depending on the amount of extra fieldwork we need to complete. We will advise pupils of an arrival time to inform you by telephone during the journey back to Gloucester.

What to take:

- Wet weather gear a good waterproof coat and trousers (it often rains)
- Warm clothing Layers, hat, scarf and gloves (we have done fieldwork in the snow before)
- Walking boots We will often be walking over rough terrain and consequently trainers are not acceptable foot ware.
- Quick drying trousers (Jeans when wet are cold and uncomfortable).
- Clipboard & carrier bag to protect field notes. Pens, pencils etc for work.
- Food and drink containers are useful for packed lunches provided by the hostel from Friday to Sunday.
- Packed lunch for outward journey on Thursday (we will be stopping at a small services).
- Clothing and toiletries.
- Camera is useful but not essential.
- Mobile phones for contacting parents on return journey.
- Day rucksack (ensure outdoor fieldwork gear is packed in this for the first day as main luggage will be inaccessible in the minibus trailer).

In order for the trip to take place, it must be self-financing, and so we invite you to make a contribution* of £165.00. Payment can be made online (Tucasi) or by cheque (payable to Sir Thomas Rich's School) or in cash. I appreciate that this may prove difficult and consequently we are happy to receive this payment in smaller instalments.
