
From the Headmaster

Vaccinations

As per my email earlier this week, all pupils between 12 and 15 years old will be offered the Pfizer vaccine in school on Tuesday 9 November. The vaccine can only be given to children who are 12 years or older on the day of vaccination. The vaccination team are also unable to give the vaccine to any children who have tested positive for

COVID-19 in the previous 28 days of the vaccination date. A reminder that there is no pressure or expectation at all from the School for students to be vaccinated; indeed it is very important for the School to remain neutral in this matter, lest parents and students feel swayed to base their view on the School's stance. I can once again assure parents that if a child does not have parental consent and does not want to take the vaccine they will not receive it, and they will of course continue to attend school and participate in activities as usual.

Today is Bonfire Night, where as a nation we celebrate a failed plot to blow up parliament. Not something we think about a great deal as we watch firework displays, but interestingly up until 1959 it was illegal NOT to celebrate Bonfire Night in Britain. This proved to be a problem during World War I and World War II, when no one was allowed to set off fireworks or light bonfires due to the blackout, and people were forced to celebrate the event indoors.
