#### **Finally**

This week, I was fascinated by reports about the discovery of polar explorer Sir Ernest Shackleton's ship Endurance at the bottom of the Weddell Sea, 107 years after it sank in the Antarctic. The ship was crushed by sea-ice and sank in 1915, forcing Shackleton and his men to make an astonishing escape on foot and in small boats in treacherous conditions. Found at over 3000 metres depth, the ship's timbers, although disrupted, are still very much together, and the name, Endurance, remains clearly visible on the stern. Marine archaeologists say it is the finest wooden shipwreck they have ever seen, and it is an incredible scientific achievement to have located and filmed the ship which was so integral to Shackleton's story. I mention it as it strikes me how endlessly enquiring and ceaselessly curious the human condition is, "Curiosity is, in great and generous minds, the first passion and the last" to quote Samuel Johnson. This spirit of intellectual enquiry, adventure and discovery is exactly what we seek to inspire in our young Richians. We know the world and life outside school can be difficult to navigate, and our aim is to provide students with the tools, confidence and courage to pursue their ambitions to the best of their, often considerable, abilities. I wish you all a pleasant and relaxing weekend, in the hope that we experience a little more of the spring sunshine we have enjoyed earlier this week.
