From the Headmaster

I promise I intend to reduce the frequency of my emails to parents to fortnightly; however, that said, it is only fair that I bring to your attention the situation regarding staff absence in school. We currently have 12 members of staff off work, mostly with COVID-19. We will do all we can to minimise the disruption to our pupils' learning but there is no doubt that we continue to face significant strain in covering classes and maintaining our normal provision – I am grateful for your forbearance as always.

In an effort to minimise further absences, we will continue with our measures of ventilating classrooms and indoor spaces by opening windows and doors where possible, encouraging regular hand washing for 20 seconds with running water and soap throughout the day and ensuring good respiratory hygiene by promoting the catch it, bin it, kill it approach. Our improved cleaning regime remains in place, with regular cleaning of frequently touched surfaces such as door handles, handrails, tabletops, etc.
