#### **Finally**

As you will know, a General Election has been announced for 4 July. Interestingly both the Conservative and Labour Party have already published very similar commitments to expand music, sport and the arts in schools. Pledges on education tend to push at an already open door with voters – more teachers, more funding, wider opportunities for young people – but until the main political parties publish their manifestos, it remains to be seen as to how much they differ, or indeed concur, on the subject of education. The pre-election period (often referred to as 'purdah') is not a

principle of law, but a convention under which public servants, councillors and officials are expected to refrain from taking controversial decisions. However, it is my firm view that it is always good to see young people confident at Rich's to talk about their own emerging political identities, engage in speech and respond positively to public debate. I also believe that the call for improved education funding can be made to all parties equally.
