

# From the Headteacher - 14 March 2025

Dear Parents

## **The Sunday Times**

We are incredibly proud to have been recognised as one of the 'happiest school for pupils in England and Wales', according to an analysis published by *The Sunday Times* on 9 March.

The newspaper used Ofsted Parent View data from 2020-25 for its article, with Sir Thomas Rich's scoring 99% for happiness of pupils. *The Sunday Times* wrote: "Official surveys show that 99 per cent of parents agreed, or strongly agreed, that their children were happy at the school, giving it one of the happiest ratings." However, it also serves to reinforce the continued effort we put into all aspects of our work at the School, not least to ensure that our ethos, curriculum, guidance and support are regularly evaluated with pupil, parent and staff voice, so that we may continue to achieve the same high standards for our pupils.

## **Emergency Lockdown Practice – Tuesday 25 March**

I would like to give you advanced notice that we intend to practice our emergency lockdown procedure on Tuesday 25 March. All pupils will be briefed in advance during tutor time so that they are fully aware that it will be happening and reminded of the protocols involved. While we do not wish to worry pupils, it will be made clear how important it is that this drill takes place to re-familiarise the school community with the procedures to follow in the unlikely event that a lockdown is required.

A reminder that our Spring Concert takes place on Thursday 20 March at 6.00pm. With such a large and talented group of musicians in the School at present, the evening promises to be highly enjoyable. ## **School Traffic and Parking**
