Year 11 Mock Examinations

I would like to congratulate Year 11 pupils on completing their mock examinations over the last two weeks; our invigilation team have praised their approach and maturity. As I mentioned in my previous email, the main purpose of these assessments will be to provide valuable feedback to help pupils focus their revision and prepare for their forthcoming GCSE examinations. The key message is that time is still very much on their side, and much can still be achieved with continued hard work and proactively acting on the advice of Year 11 teachers.

Mock Trial Competition

Pupils in Years 8 and 9 can now sign up to take part in the Mock Trial Competition, which takes place on 11 March. This exciting opportunity allows pupils to work as a team and bring a real courtroom trial to life, performing in front of real magistrates. A wide range of roles are available, including solicitors, witnesses, magistrates, court reporters, court artists and ushers, giving pupils the chance to showcase key skills in confidence, communication skills and quick thinking.

Pupils are encouraged to sign up via the Microsoft Form on Satchel One.

House Music

Pupils in all year groups are also invited to take part in House Music 2026, with the final performance taking place on Monday 23 March. Events include Junior Solo (Years 7-10), Senior Solo (Years 11-13) and an Open Category (Years 7-13). Sign-up is open now, via House Captains, with auditions beginning from Monday 2 February. New for 2026, pupils can also earn House Participation Points simply by auditioning. Alongside many of our other House Competitions, this event is an excellent opportunity for pupils to showcase the incredible creative and musical talents that exist in the School.

Extracurricular


