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Sir Thomas Rich's - Register of Indicated Interest

For in year Entry into Years 7, 8, 9, 10 & 11

Parents seeking admission for their child into a year group which is already full, will be advised of the appeal process and offered the opportunity to join the Register of Indicated Interest.

Parents who ask to be put on the Register of Indicated Interest will complete a form with the child's details, which will be held by the School until the end of each academic year. **Parents who wish to remain on the register beyond one academic year, must contact the School, in writing, by 31 August, each year.**

If a place becomes available, all parents who have registered an interest in that year group, will be contacted and their child invited to sit the Sir Thomas Rich's Admission Tests.

The tests can only be sat once for entry into each academic year. There are no re-sits. The test result will stand for entry to that year group.

Sir Thomas Rich's will invite students to one test date. However, if the School are satisfied that there are extenuating circumstances, an alternative date may be offered. Students may be able to sit the test at their current School, at Sir Thomas Rich's discretion, providing the student's current Head Teacher has agreed to make appropriate arrangements to administer the tests.

If more than one child passes the tests, the places will be offered in line with our Admissions Policy oversubscription criteria, as follows, in this order:

- a. A 'looked after child' (**see Note 1**)
- b. Boys registered for Pupil Premium (**see Note 2**)
- c. Other qualifying boys in test rank order

Note 1

A 'looked after child' (LAC) [1] or a child who was previously looked after (PLAC) but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption [2] child arrangements order (residency order) [3] or special guardianship order (4), or an 'internationally adopted previously looked after child' (IAPLAC) [5].

[1] *A 'looked after child' is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989) at the time of making an application to a school. In Gloucestershire, such children are referred to as Children in Care.*

[2] *This includes children who were adopted under the Adoption Act 1976 (see section 12 adoption orders) and children who were adopted under the Adoption and Children Act 2002 (see section 46 adoption orders).*

[3] *Under the provisions of section 12 of the Children and Families Act 2014, which amend section 8 of the Children Act 1989, residence orders have now been replaced by child arrangements orders.*

[4] *See Section 14A of the Children Act 1989 which defines a 'special guardianship order' as an order appointing one or more individuals to be a child's special guardian (or special guardians).*

[5] *This also includes children who appear to the School to have been in state care outside England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted.*

Note 2

Children attracting Pupil Premium are those who have been registered for free school meals at any point in the six years prior to the closing date for registration for the Test. The School will require independent and verifiable evidence of Pupil Premium entitlement in the requisite period from a reliable source such as a local authority. The school will make such enquiries as are necessary of GCC (or the relevant Local Authority) as to the entitlement of any children who have qualified when notifying GCC of the Test results.

In the event of a tie-break situation, the child living nearest the School will be offered the place.

Parents will be advised of the appeal process if the School is not able to offer a place to their child. Parents of boys who have met the required standard, but who are not offered a place, will be asked if they wish to remain on the

Indicated Interest Register, should a place in that year group become available before the end of the academic year for which they sat the Admission Tests.

A child who has not met the required standard can remain on the Indicated Interest Register, but will only be considered for entry into the following academic year, and will be offered the opportunity to sit the Admission Tests for entry into that year group, should a place become available.

Parents must have confirmed in writing that they wish to remain on the Indicated Interest Register.

Should a further place become available, all those who have joined the register since the last testing date will be invited to sit the Admission Tests.

Their results will be considered along with any boys who passed the tests at a previous testing date, but were not offered a place. The School may ask to see School Reports to confirm that any previously qualifying student is continuing to make appropriate progress. Again, if more than one child passes the tests, the place will be offered to the child who has the best results.

By completing an Indicated Register Form, parents are agreeing that Sir Thomas Rich's can hold data on their child. A copy of the School's Admission Policy is available on the School website
